Minutes of the 12th Governing Council Meeting of Kerala Catholic Society held on 9th October 2021 at KCS House, 23 Halls Road, Kilpauk, Chennai - 600010 at 6 pm

Approval of the Minutes: Minutes of the GC meeting held on 11.09.2021 was circulated and approved after discussion

Review of the Accounts: Accounts for the month of Sep'21 was circulated and approved after review.

Nomination Committee selection- GC Members: It was decided that as three positions are to be filled up for next 4 terms, the nomination committee headed by its Chairman Mr. Malcolm Joseph is required to select three members and induct them virtually on 30.09.21.

Reconstitution of GC: It was decided to reconstitute the GC with 10 members as follows -(1)President (2) Vice President (3) Secretary (4) Treasurer (5) Lady Representative (6)Youth Representative (7) Zonal Representative (ZR) - Adyar (8) ZR - Anna Nagar (9) ZR - Kilpauk (10) ZR - Kodambakkam.

Legacy projects - Dialysis unit: It was informed that Rs.130 lakhs is the total requirement - KCS contribution will be Rs.65 lakhs. A committee has been formed to advise GC on this project and the members would be Mr. Kurian Manavalan, Dr. V.M.Kurian and Mr. Joseph Dominic.

Silver Jubilee: It was suggested that as Mr. Peter Alphonse, Minority Commission Chairman, being a politician, might reschedule his programmes on short notice, it is better to select one more person as Chief Guest for the Silver Jubilee celebration scheduled at 6.30 pm on 19th February 2022 at ITC Welcome Hotel, after holy mass at Santhome Cathedral by Bishop.

Youtube: It was suggested that the video of our 25 years is to be produced. Decided further that a Sound engineer / Voice professional service could be hired for the video making.

I am a born patriot! Rather I chose to be born as a true patriot! Some readers may raise their eye brows when I make this claim! Why am I making such tall claims? Simple! I was born in 1942, when Quit India movement launched by Mahatma Gandhi was at its crescendo! Gandhiji asked the British rulers to quit India and hearing his exhortation, I quit the cosy comfort zone of my mother's womb, to join the freedom fighters. Tell me now, am I not a born patriot?

While travelling to US of A once, the passenger sitting next to me in the Jet Airways aircraft made small talk with me. When asked where I was born, I answered "GOLD HILL"! The Communist Govt in power ordered closure of the school and all students were given Transfer Certificates to neighbouring schools. The next academic year, a new Govt High School was opened at Ponkunnam and I was admitted to 11th Standard. All teachers of KVHS, who lost their jobs, were given jobs in the new school.

M E Joseph sir was the first headmaster of the new school. He had to build it from scratch. He was our neighbour and like us a true Roman Catholic. Joseph

sir quickly spotted my academic talents and encouraged me to do well in all subjects, especially in English, which was his forte. He was the father of 11 children, one of whom was my junior in the same school. Joseph sir used to give me English books, mostly novels, to read. There was no library in the new school, which was functioning in temporary thatched sheds. He used to correct my English answer sheets and encouraged me to excel in the Queen's tongue. In turn, I did him proud by being the school topper and probably a state topper for English for SSLC!

There was a small public library in my town, which was my regular haunt during evenings and holidays. Never keen on sports and games, I soon became a confirmed book worm. Romantic novels, both in English and Malayalam, were my favourites! I soon became a voracious reader of Malayalam magazines, especially MATHRUBHOOMI, which used to publish romantic novels in series every week, apart from travelogues by well known writer S.K Pottekkad.


At the age of sixteen, I started dreaming: dreams of romance, of course! , powered and inspired by the many romantic novels I used to hungrily read! I was attracted to a very fair and beautiful girl who was my junior in the same school. I made discreet enquiries about her. I was told by the peon, also my neighbour, that her name is Gracy. A very apt and appropriate name, I thought .I was too shy to approach her and talk. Also, during those times, a boy talking to a girl was taboo and unthinkable. I was crazy about Gracy is an understatement!.

I confided to my close friend and neighbour Thomas Sebastian about my infatuation to Gracy. He was known by his house name ATHYALI.A true and trustworthy friend, ATHYALI used to give a patient hearing to me and gave unsolicited advice too. He told

There is a MOU between Chennai Corporation, Rotary Club and Tanker Foundation in this regard wherein space is provided by Chennai Corporation, Tanker will manage the centre and Rotary Club will invest or identify partners for infrastructures. KCS will be partnering with Rotary and share 50% of total project cost ie Rs. 65 lakhs (Total project cost estimated is Rs.1.30 crores)

Eight of our members have volunteered to donate machines and few others have committed contribution towards necessary infrastructure cost. Still require around Rs.10 lakhs, please be generous. Planning to launch the centre before our Silver jubilee Celebrations.



Urban Health Centre, Padi, Ambattur, Chennai will soon have 12 dialysis machines for free treatment to the needy, and 8 out of that will be donated by the KCS members. We pray for those generous KCS members & family. These machines normally last for 12 years and around 60,000 free dialysis can be given which is an humungous help to those in need.
